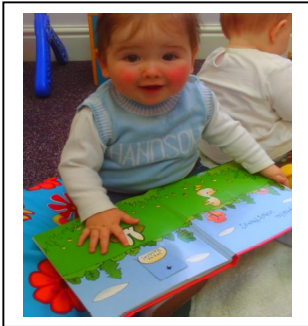
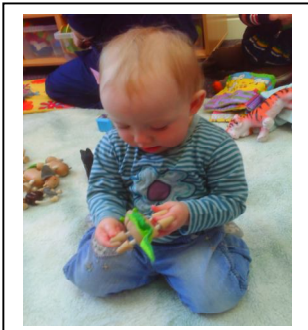


Animals

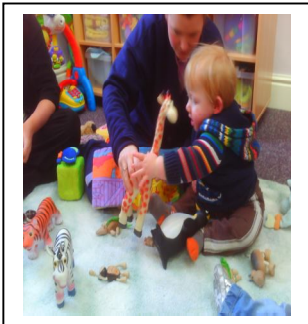

The babies can handle books and their attention is drawn to the pictures.

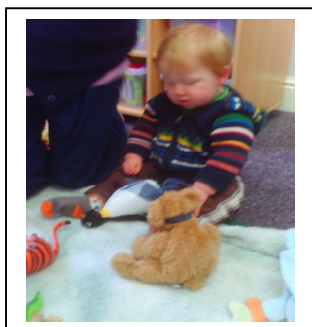
Communication, language and literacy- 8-20 months

Babies show interest in stories, songs and rhymes.

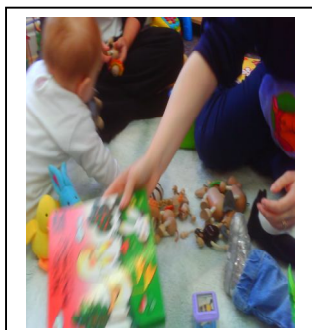
Language for communication-0-11 months.

Make sounds with their voices in social interaction.

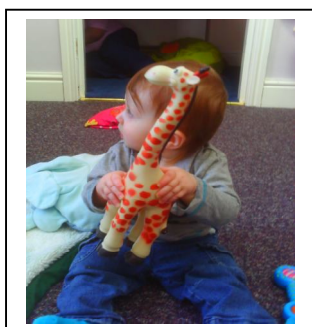
The babies make animal sounds to the music- moo, quack etc.
